## YOUTH GROUP

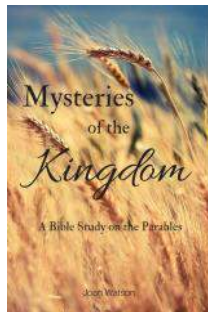
Our next meeting is this Sunday, August 20 at 6:30 PM in the Teen Hall, 7-12 Grade. We will begin in the church with Vespers.

## DIOCESAN EVENTS

### CATECHETICAL FORMATION PROGRAM

We are called to continual conversion and growth in faith. To provide the ongoing spiritual formation needed to nurture this growth, the Diocese of Nashville, in collaboration with Aquinas College, offers a Catechetical Formation Program for adults.

The Catechetical Formation Program, open to all adults, offers participants the opportunity to learn from systematic continuing education in the truths of the Catholic faith. Catechists who complete the Catechetical Formation Program requirements earn the title of Certified Catechist.

This Fall, join the program for teaching on what is Faith, what it means to live a Life in Christ, the Sacrament of Baptism and why people desire God.

**\*NEW THIS YEAR:\*** They are no longer requiring the Orientation session, class reflection papers, or 20 Independent Hours (18 hours every 3 years are still required for renewal.) There is also no limit to how many classes can be taken online. If you have completed courses in the past it is not necessary to take them over again.

### PRO LIFE AND HUMAN DIGNITY PILGRIMAGE Diocese of Nashville Youth Office

For years, the Diocese of Nashville has been attending the annual D.C. March for Life (Upcoming: January 19, 2018) to peacefully protest the Supreme Court Decision, Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortions in our country. This year, we plan to expand this valuable life experience by enhancing the pilgrimage to include various other means to unpack the Church's teaching on the dignity of the human being. Some of these experiences will include visiting the Holocaust Memorial Museum, Arlington National Cemetery, several war memorials, the Saint John Paul II Shrine, and several of our wonderful churches to be spiritually nourished along the way.

Costs would be similar to previous years pilgrimages (around \$250-300) and would cover airfare, hotel stay, and any ticketing for any experiences during our pilgrimage and the pilgrimage would last a total of 5 days (travel included).
