The Brewster Family will take the cup home after 9AM Mass on Sunday.



VOCATION BLESSING CUP

Each week a parish family or individual takes home the Vocation Blessing Cup and intentionally prays for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life and for those who already serve the Church. The Vocation Blessing Cup's purpose is to inspire a greater awareness of God's call within our community.



How the Program Works

Each week at Mass, an assigned family is invited to take the gifts up at the Offertory Procession. At the end of Mass, the family is called by the priest to come forward to receive the Vocation Cup and a blessing. (They collect the Vocation Blessing Cup, the prayer card, and from the Vestibule they choose the Seminarian/Priest/Sister who they will pray for). The family takes the Vocation Cup home and puts it in a place of honor.

Each day for a week, during prayer time (morning, bedtime or at meals), the family prays for an increase and perseverance of vocations. They can also send a note of support to a Seminarian, Priest or Sister. The following Sunday the family returns the chalice back for another family to take home. To take home the Vocation Cup for a week, call the office or Fr. Zack.
