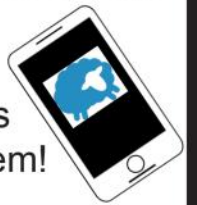

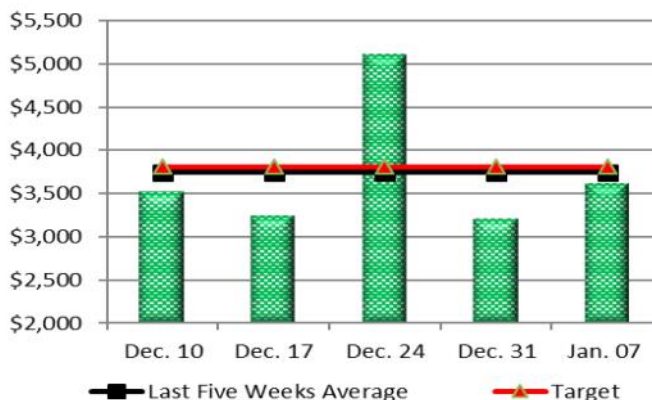


OFFERTORY REPORT - JANUARY 7, 2018
